DISCOVER THE ONE JAPANESE ART

An exhibition introducing artwork by artists currently working in Japan, entitled "Discover the One Japanese Art," was held at the Menier Gallery, close to the City of London, between May 17 to 21, 2016.

There was a wide variety of genres of art on show, all hugely varied in style, approach and technique, ranging from Japanese traditional culture to other works where the artists adopted a more international style to express their ideas, with many kinds of materials, from painting and drawing to ceramics, textiles and even metals, all being used.

A number of prestigious prizes were selected and announced, evaluated by two judges and also exhibition visitors, with Professor Timon Screech, from the Department of the History of Art and Archaeology School of Arts at University of London, and Nicholas Usherwood, Features Editor at Galleries Magazine, acting as the professional selectors.



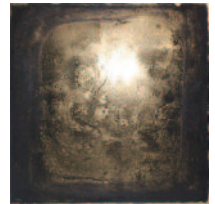

With art becoming such a globalised commodity these days, thanks in large part to the impact of international art-fairs, it is often hard to see, let alone understand, the broad range of art being produced in any one country. Thus, when I was asked to take part in selecting my favourite piece from the recent Menier Gallery exhibition 'Discover the One Japanese Art' in May this year, I was delighted to accept the quite excellent opportunity it provided to assess the kind of work currently being produced within one of the world's great economies – and something all too rarely seen in this country. It was a big show, with some 200 works selected in Japan for showing in this country, the art hugely varied in style and approach. On the one hand there were those pieces which chose to adapt the styles and techniques of Western art to Japanese themes and, on the other, artists working out of what felt like more traditional Japanese techniques but in a distinctly modern idiom.

My favourite work was one of the latter, Mika Yajima's '9x 9 Composition Whirlpool', an abstract textile piece of intricate woven textile and foil, simple, powerful and delicate. In short this was a fascinating scheme and one which I hope will be repeated in London in 2017.

Take to the hills

Here's one of the nicest artistic stories of the year so far; the innovative and lively **Cupola Contemporary Art** in Sheffield, wanting to celebrate 25 years trading on the Middlewood Road in the Hillsborough district and, at the same time, give something back to the community that had supported it over that time, decided to hold an arts festival.

However, after several public community consultation meetings and events, it quickly became clear that the people of Hillsborough – both the residents and business community – wanted something altogether more ambitious to put the place back on the map. And, given the still powerful memories of the football stadium disaster there in 1989, 'for all the right reasons' too. From there the idea has just grown and grown, and with good support from the city council, Arts Council and many other such bodies public and private.

Thus, on 9 and 10 July, Hillsborough Park becomes home to **HillsFest**, a two day arts and music festival, the whole venue being transformed by several very glamorous looking inflatable domes capable of holding 800 people standing, and with themed zones to include a creative showcase, makers' activities, sound and movement, spoken word, film and taste.

There'll be loads of other fun

and games, music and general jollity – what a gas, as they say, and all stemming from huge creative energy and good will with artists and everyone involved contributing time and energy.

Future perfect

Artistic reputation, like any other, is always a matter of timing and the modernist sculptor Frank Dobson's was, as it turned out, just a little awry. Born in 1886, just 12 years before Henry Moore, Dobson, along with Epstein and Gaudier-Brzeska, he was seen in the 1920s and 30s as among the most important figures in British avant-garde sculpture.

However post-war, the rise and rise of the younger generation of Moore, Hepworth et al, made him into one of the strangely forgotten figures of British 20th century art, something that not even a major Arts Council show in 1966 was able to turn around. The next big show in 1994, ironically enough, at the Henry Moore Foundation itself, got the scholars interested but still not a wider public.

Now the ever enterprising **Goldmark Gallery** is taking up the challenge, harnessing the scholarly reassessments that have been growing steadily in the interval with a major show of his sculptures and drawings. Their timing, as ever, seems immaculate and one senses that this time it may finally happen

The work is just too good, its

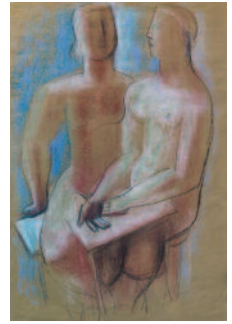
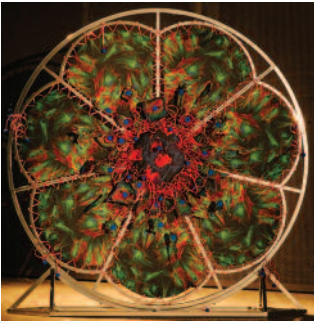
understandings of Cubist and Vorticist ideas, not to mention Gauguin and Cezanne's paintings and drawings as applied to the human figure; they are acute and powerful and genuinely original too.

Spirit moving

I first encountered Ana Maria Pacheco's extraordinary and monumental 2008 installation sculpture 'Shadows of the Wanderer' in 2010 in St John's Church, Waterloo where, placed in the aisle of this busy working church on the edge of a roundabout of heaving traffic, it provoked the most profound sensations of terror and pity, its calm but scarifying evocation of a nameless human dread of exile and eviction like nothing else in contemporary British art.

I was one of hundreds who, similarly moved, attended the talks and discussions that were organised around it – with the Brazilian-born artist at the event herself, and Neil MacGregor, then of the British Museum among the speakers. Its journey of public showings – organised by Susan Pratt of Pratt Contemporary then and since – started in Aldeburgh, followed by London Waterloo, Canterbury and Kiev – grander and grander venues, culminating in Norwich Cathedral last year and now, in July 2016, **Chichester Cathedral**.

Far from being overwhelmed by



the surroundings' antiquity and magnificence, the work seems rather to focus the spiritual relevance, the ever-approaching terrors of the refugee crisis in Syria and the Middle East underlying ever more emphatically its simple and magnificent story, one seemingly deriving from the opening of Virgil's *Aeneid*, as Aeneas carries his crippled father Anchises out of the burning ruins of Troy.

It is one of the key sculptures of our generation; if you have yet to see it, go now.

Cornish catch

Cornwall comes to London this month with a group of renowned contemporary artists at the **A & D Gallery** showing 'West Cornwall Perspectives'. Organised by dealers Eleven and a Half, it includes names like Terry Whybrow, Ben Catt, Michael Praed and John Piper (not that one!), and with work ranging across painting, sculpture and ceramics, this looks well worth catching.

Also worth noting in this context is **Cricket Fine Art** who are mounting a Cornish themed show 'Out of Cornwall Past and Present'. Some good names here too: Fred Yates, Terry Frost, Nicola Hicks, Mary Stork and David Pearce among them.

Clear picture

Founded nearly 160 years ago as the Society of Female Artists, today's Society of Women Artists remains, for all the apparent huge shifts in attitude towards the idea of women artists that has occurred over the last four decades or so, a hugely thriving – currently 140 members – and much needed organisation, as their latest, extremely punchy 155th Annual Open Exhibition at the **Mall Galleries** makes more than clear.

For although many of the members of the Society are now also members of other major exhibiting bodies, a clearly female voice about what they would like their art to convey can often remain surprisingly muffled – similarly with the lively 'open' aspect. I am a big fan of this show and can highly recommend it.

Think landscape

"Whoever told people that 'mind' means thoughts, opinions, ideas and concepts" the great Zen master Dogen once observed. "Mind means trees, fence posts, tiles and grasses", an understanding of the phenomenological nature of seen experience that the writer Mel Gooding uses to quiet effect in his catalogue essay accompanying Sally McLaren's 80th birthday retrospective exhibition at **Bankside Gallery**.

Equally accomplished as both a painter and a printmaker – she was a founder member of the Printmakers' Council back in 1961 – McLaren's artistic language has always been profoundly shaped by the landscape in which she has been living, in particular that of East Dorset, her home since the late 70s. As anyone who knows it in the slightest, it is a landscape particularly resonant with human history and though McLaren's art is never directly concerned with this particular aspect of its appearance, her deep sensitivity to its inherent truth informs these lyrical, sensitive evocations of the place – its winds, clouds and changing light – arriving at a vision of subtle truths.

Amends

Last month's piece about **Cynthia Corbett's** Young Masters project may have given the impression that Deborah Azzopardi is one of the Young Masters in question. She is, of course, a Pop artist of some 30 years standing, her participation here being in her own right.

Coming home

Sometimes an artistic style can get just too far ahead of the prevailing aesthetic of its time and place. So it was with Peter Lowe and the Systems Group that emerged in the late 60s who, despite a reasonable degree of support from 'official' art channels for a period in the early 70s, never really clicked with British dealers or collectors, their austere degree of mathematical-seeming abstraction just too much for an audience never entirely comfortable with abstract art of any kind in the first place.

Not so in Europe, fortunately for Lowe or the Group, whose work has been widely revered there, shown, collected and understood, very much as part of the ongoing Constructionist aesthetic that emerged out of Bauhaus principles in the post-war period, Max Bill et al.

Now it would seem, this neglected avant garde is coming home at last, with a show of Lowe's work over the last half century (his first in 11 years) at **Waterhouse & Dodd**, and a planned spotlight exhibition of Systems art at **Tate Britain**.

Looking at Lowe's work now it is really hard to see just what the problem could ever have been, the sheer purity and richness of invention in both the reliefs, 2D and 3D pieces, such that there is really not a single piece here that won't cause the greatest visual pleasure and intellectual satisfaction. **Nicholas Usherwood**

Different paths

Austin/Desmond Fine Art have always had a keen eye for the less well trodden aspects of 20th century British Art and Design, and their current summer survey show is no exception, ranging as it does from Michael Cardew ceramics to Karl Weschke landscapes. There are, of course, many expected names here as well – Ben Nicholson, Ivon Hitchens, William Scott, Patrick Heron, Roger Hilton and Tracey Emin among them – but when the eye is as keen as theirs usually is, it's always a really good example.

My eye meanwhile has a tendency to veer from the mainstream towards eccentrics and members of the 'awkward squad' and there is plenty of that here as well. For example, a superb group of Prunella Clough paintings and prints including one of the toughest and most mysterious examples of her immediate post-war paintings ('Untitled' c.1946) with its uncomfortable figure buried in a seemingly underground chamber beneath a sombre landscape.

Or, by way of contrast, the still undervalued Richard Eurich, with one of his late, pearly, luminescent Solent seascapes, apparently casual yet filled with the phenomenological mysteries of the thing 'seen' ('Wind Surfer Seascape' 1984). Or even the wonderfully eccentric, surrealist inspired composition by Humphrey Spender 'Arterial Man' (1940). Enough already! **NU**

Lining up

There can't be many works of art, from an installation to Michelangelo's *St Peter's*, that haven't started with a pencil stroke on a piece of paper. The medium of a drawn line is also broad and varied, from a silver point to a piece of coarse charcoal, and all affected by the structure of the paper it is made on. A 'finished drawing' is as much a work of art as a painting or any other construction and it shouldn't be scorned for being on paper. Such artworks are an affordable way to start a collection by often highly sought after artists.

Piers Feetham aims "to support drawing" with regular summer shows under the title 'Drawn to the Line', giving artists the opportunity to show drawings which are finished works rather than sketches or preparatory. July's show is no exception – from Victoria Achache to Laetitia Yhap, Elisabeth Vellacott to Paul Rumsey and more.

It's also appropriate that the **Royal Drawing School** starts its summer programme from July 4 – an opportunity for anyone with a known or unknown skill to benefit from tuition by specialists and discover, improve, master or review techniques. **Paul Hooper**

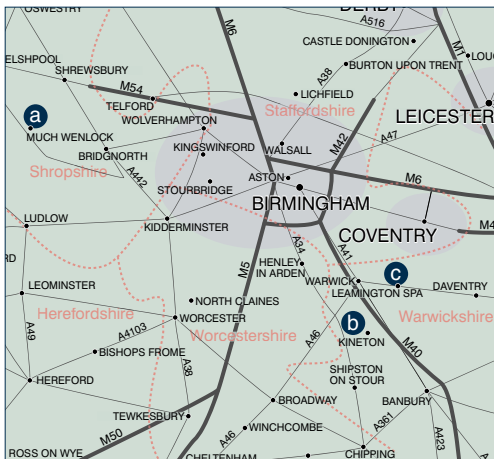


Jock MacInnes 'Sunset Over Atrian'

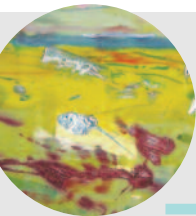

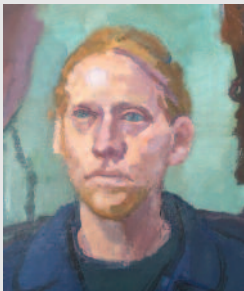

A chance meeting at a party in Dartmoor in 2006 sparked the inspiration for Trevor Felcey's Martin series of portraits over the next six years which the artist described as "of the same person but all very different paintings." In his biography of Felcey, Andrew Lambirth says Felcey's ideas are "to do with visualizing . . . if they could be written he would be a writer." In his pursuit of reality Felcey also paints and draws landscapes and still lifes in all mediums. Born in 1945, Felcey attended Grimbsy then Camberwell art schools rounding off at the Royal College from 1966-69.

The lively, well established art scene which made Open Studios Cornwall week in May/June so rewarding, keeps the momentum going this month with galleries showing just how varied the work produced can be.

First up is artists' collective **Padstow Studio**, run by painter Sarah Adams, celebrating a 10th anniversary this year and continuing to champion artists working in both Cornwall and further afield with contemporary paintings, drawings and sculpture.

St Ives, as ever, is a big draw for art inspired visitors – even with the temporary closure of the Tate for building work. A local gem of civic pride is The Barbara Hepworth Sculpture Garden where visitors can explore her life and work and view the studio in her former home before lingering in lush gardens to commune with her sculpture.

When **Belgrave St Ives** opened a spit away in 1998 they specialised in Modern British work, particularly in the context of St Ives; increasingly they are also featuring local contemporary artists. In the current exhibition the focus is on the maritime themed paintings of Ffiona Lewis shown in tandem with work by such notables as Hilton, Frost and Hepworth.

On the road west out of St Ives you come to Morvah and **Yew Tree Gallery**. The current exhibition here, 'Joie de Vivre' combines the work of six artists who celebrate just this – whether

in the paintings of Simon Pooley, full of colour and movement, or those of Charlotte Lyon, figurative work that exemplifies the joy to be found in small moments of being, or the witty, whimsical automata crafted by Esther Smith; it is there too in the off-beat sense of fun embodied by Ardyn Griffin's papier mâché figures.

Recently moved from St Ives to St Just is **Petronilla Silver** who specialises in showing a mix of contemporary fine and applied art. This month it is ceramicist Sara Moorhouse's work, inspired by local light and colour.

From an installation in Penzance station to his involvement with local environmental issues the name Kurt Jackson has, since his move here in 1984, become increasingly synonymous with Cornwall and its art. The **Jackson Foundation** in St Just is now in its second year showcasing both his work and concerns. For the current exhibition, a collaboration with writers as diverse as naturalist Richard Mabey and Glastonbury impresario Michael Eavis, Jackson dwells on that tantalizing concept, 'a sense of place', in the British landscape as it is perceived by others.

Penzance/Newlyn is thrice blessed with excellent public galleries. The town's own Penlee House holds an unrivalled collection of Newlyn School paintings while **The Exchange**



and **Newlyn Gallery** fly the flag for cutting edge. Currently they are showing the work of artist Imran Qureshi. In a tripartite exhibition Newlyn is displaying his works on paper recalling the intricate delicacy of Mughal Miniatures subverted to reflect a contemporary idiom, while at The Exchange Qureshi has created an installation where painted images spill from the canvas across walls and floors with a fluidity that reflects on the nearness of the sea and the depiction of water in traditional miniature painting. The third venue is Truro Cathedral (until 15 July) where his vast installation occupies much of the south aisle, spills over pews and flows into the nave.

Out of Helston, on the edge of Helford is the contemporary space **Kestle Barton**; this month's show is of Nicola Bealing's 'dark and perceptive commentary on human nature'.

Cornish art is a major theme at **Tregony Gallery**, recently taken over by Judi and Brian Green, who continue to promote local artists, and in their summer show they have introduced the Tregony Gallery Art Prize showcasing exceptional work from Truro and Penwith College.

Headed up by Chris Insoll, **The New Gallery** at Porthscatho aims to be a community of artists first and a 'showroom' second, providing access to some of the area's best artists' work.

While possessing nothing like the density of galleries to be found in Cornwall, the South Devon and Dorset coastline does have an increasing number of excellent public and commercial venues as well as something of an explosion of major open studios, including **Drawn to the Valley** who have their Open Studios' pre exhibition in Tavistock Town Hall this month.

And while there is no **Tate St Ives** here there are nonetheless some enterprising public galleries; for example, the very well run **Royal Albert Memorial Museum & Art Gallery** in Exeter, this month, appropriately enough, given over to all things floral with special exhibitions featuring both the International Garden Photographer of the Year and 'Flower Power' – 19th century botanical illustrations from India.

Meanwhile the consistently imaginative **Thelma Hulbert Gallery** in Honiton, gives full expression to the burgeoning contemporary artistic creativity of the area with its THG Summer Open 2016 – some 93 pieces selected from a record breaking entry – and selected to a very impressive standard.

On to the stunning East Devon coast, the galleries come thick and fast with, first up, the long-established **Marine House at Beer**, with selections of work from over 100 national and regional artists, crafts always on display and often a major solo show too.

Moving across the county boundary into Dorset, is the intensely picturesque, 'foody' seaside town of Lyme Regis. It now has an artistic focus to match, with the comparatively recent advent of the **Town Mill Galleries**, two handsome adjoining spaces, the Courtyard and Malthouse Galleries, run year round by a not-for-profit, membership funded organisation, Town Mill Arts, within a larger Town Mill

complex. This is just such a great venue, the shows, by largely regionally based artists, all to such a high standard.

For example, at the end of the month, Deborah Wood of the much lamented **Art Room** in Topsham (now operating as an online gallery), is curating a show entitled 'Expression' featuring three extremely distinguished artists with close connections to the region, veteran, landscape-based abstract painters John Hubbard and Patrick Jones and ceramicist Chris Prindl, all with connections to the USA.

Further east along the coast is the village of Morecombelake and **Artwave West**, a really attractive space converted from a

former pub in 2009 by owners Martin and Donna Goold. This well run gallery is to be admired for the way they have kept up the artistic standards here – not so easy always in such a particularly tourist-dominated place – with work by leading exhibitors at the **Royal Academy** and **Mall Galleries** in London, alongside younger professionals and a nice mix of figurative and abstract styles.

Their June/July special show for example, 'Responses in Colour', features the work of five well established colouristic painters, among them the superb Cornish-based landscape artist Louise McLary.

This coast's central artistic hub is arguably Bridport, and the gallery that has done as much as any to put the area on the map artistically is **Sladers Yard**. This is really more of an art centre than just a gallery, it was founded in the early Noughties and exhibits excellent contemporary British art, furniture and craft as well as running a programme of live evening events.

Their current shows, of painter Alex Lowery and 80 year old ceramicist, Richard Batterham, are typical; Lowery's cool, subtle visions of this coast and its settlements are intensely atmospheric and poetic in character, Batterham's ceramics just plain distinguished.

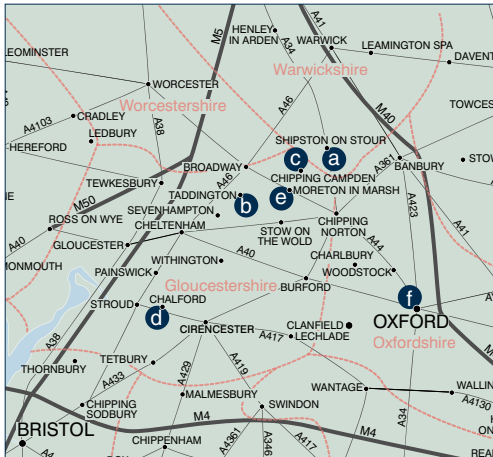

It is 10 years since experienced gallerist Kelly Ross headed out of London to picturesque Child Okeford in Dorset and opened **Art Stable** – this after many years at **Austin/Desmond Fine Art** followed by running her own Coram Gallery. The 10th anniversary show is of work by a mixed group of gallery artists plus three mid 20th century artists including Londoner David Gommon (1913–87) who fell in

love with the Dorset landscape after cycling there in the 1930s. As a young artist he was exhibited alongside names including Henry Moore and Cedric Morris, with early work influenced by Neo Romantics including Paul Nash and Graham Sutherland. Later watercolours were bolder, brighter and stronger with inspiration from the Dorset landscape and coastline.

With his first solo show at the Piccadilly Gallery in 1954, aged just 22, and a first retrospective at Coventry Art Gallery five years later, David Tindle was seen as something of a rising artistic star of his generation. Yet, for all the solid teaching career that followed – Hornsey and RCA – and membership of the RA in the early 70s, Tindle's name has remained comparatively (and puzzlingly) unknown to a wide,

more recent public. It is something to do with the quiet and delicate reticence of the painstaking egg-tempera still lifes and interiors that followed his explosive start as a realist painter, but none the worse for that, with the powerful sense of Renaissance calm and contemplation, they convey a reflection of his passion for Italy where he now lives and works. CODA

Aktis Gallery specialises in the work of émigré artists who went to early 20th century Paris. Like much of the art that they represent, the cover image for the Aktis exhibition of inter-war Parisian works on paper is simultaneously familiar, beautiful and impassive.

It features an assortment of pink and yellow tulips with slightly stylised petals and leaves, and long delicate stems snaking up a dark blue ground. The high detail and light shading give it the aspect of a botanical illustration, but the manipulation of the forms have a distinctly Asian quality.

The work has a place at the exhibition because it is by the Japanese-French artist Léonard

Tsuguharu Foujita (1886-1968), who was one of the oldest School of Paris members and a friend of Braque, Picasso and Rousseau.

Aktis' exhibition runs from 1 to 31 July as part of London Art Week, a celebration of 'pre-contemporary' art in the galleries of Mayfair and St James's, to show some of their best to the thronging summer crowds. For Aktis, exhibiting Foujita alongside Le Corbusier, Otto Freundlich and Auguste Herbin is a chance to demonstrate his power, even alongside his better known counterparts, as an artist at home both with European modernism and a traditionally Japanese aesthetic – as well as Paris itself.
