CRITICAL NOTES:- These paintings are revolutionary using the life model to produce exhibitable work is a completely new concept the reverse of creating saleable images of nubile nudes.

There is another way that they are revolutionary.

Picasso et al unleashed a ferocious reaction against the prevailing art of the 19th Century.

As the First World War defined the 20th Century, the current Depression is defining this Century, sweeping away the fictitious values of securities and rubbish art.

A new 21st Century art is needed, and this work, by not compromising the values of the Life Room, by struggling to re-create painterly, gimmick-free form that avoids formula and a dreary return to the past, is a radical contrast to the stale devices of the 20th Century.
