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Acclaimed artist Vaughan Grylls to show work at the Landmark Show 2013 in association with The Piper Gallery

London, 24 November 2012: One of the country's most exciting photographers and sculptors, Vaughan Grylls, presents a solo exhibition at the Landmark Show January 2013.

For over 40 years, Grylls has been producing work that challenges our perception of photography as a medium. He deals with what many people would consider photomontage, but in an ingenious way. Photographs are pinned together, or merged on a computer, printed out, sometimes framed and arranged to create a distinctive configuration. Grylls' work produces an honest representation of the subject he is exploring. He dissects pieces, always from a very personal historical, political or religious perspective. Each photograph tells a story that illustrates its context and draws the viewer in ever closer to reflect on its motivation.

The centrepiece of this exciting solo exhibition is Grylls' work, *Grandmother 2011*, which is a life-size Dornier 217 bomber constructed from over 1000 photographs. The Landmark provides an amazing space in which to display this work, measuring 5 x 19 x 3 metres (materials: bedsheets, washing lines, wooden clothes pegs, monochrome photos, diaper pins and a 1943 pram), together with the artist's other innovative and experimental works.



Commenting on the exhibition, Ben Kidger, Landmark Gallery Curator, said: "Vaughan Grylls has been deeply influential in the photomontage genre for many years. We are delighted that the Landmark will provide him with a dramatic backdrop enabling him to show his work to such great effect".

Gallery founder and director Megan Piper says: "Grandmother was the first work that The Piper Gallery exhibited, in May 2011. It is exciting to see it again at the Landmark, an extraordinary space for a powerful installation in which Grylls uses an image of death to affirm life."

Vaughan Grylls

Vaughan Grylls is a British artist, sculptor and fine art photographer, born in Newark 1943. He studied at Nottingham, Wolverhampton, Goldsmiths and the Slade School of Fine Art and has established a career that spans from the late 1960s to the present day. Grylls' works have been exhibited at a large number of galleries including The Institute of Contemporary Art, The Photographer's Gallery, Arnolfini and the Whitechapel Gallery. He is represented in several public collections including Unilever, Polaroid and the Arts Council of Wales. Grylls was Head of Art and Design at the University of Wolverhampton (1989-1996). He went on to be Director of the Kent Institute of Art and Design until 2005, when he co-founded the University for the Creative Arts at Canterbury, Epsom, Farnham, Maidstone and Rochester. Grylls now divides his time between London, Kent and Italy.
