"The Tricycle has its three wheels - theatre, cinema and visual art, an idea that inspired the title of this exhibition. My life seems to have three wheels, though in my case they're art, poetry and family and friends. This show coincidentally focuses on three areas of work: landscape, figure painting and portraiture. Without all these various triangulations I'd probably be lost.

"Thirty years ago I came to the Tricycle to see the Liverpool Poets. Within a month my first exhibition "Flat Earth" was showing in the Gallery, which has played a significant part in my life ever since. Ten years later 'Sue, Realist', my first collection of poems and drawings was launched in the Baldwin Room. More recently, the Tricycle has hosted events for The Brondesbury Group, the NW London poetry group I convene and will be hosting our 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary reading on Friday 22nd June.

"In fact I've always had at least nine lives - though unlike a cat's they've tended to run concurrently: painter, printmaker, poet, sculptor, theatre designer, teacher, parent and arts administrator. Of 'Flat Earth' Richard Cork wrote, "Like many other women, Susan Whitmore is no stranger to the conflicting demands of art and motherhood. Her exhibition at the Tricycle Gallery is dominated by figures undergoing sudden, perplexing shifts of identity". So in thirty years, apart from adding even more identities, nothing has really changed.

"Recent exhibitions have centred on the Marina Baja mountains of Spain where I mentor a landscape painting course every summer. I've recently joined Greenwich Printmakers and the show reflects a move back into printmaking. The human body, trees, words and imagination are central to my work, and the figure paintings in this exhibition are products of the Tricycle's Thursday Life Class - which I mentor - and which plays a central role in the lives of many local artists and students".
