WE ARE MACMILLAN. CANCER SUPPORT

In 2011 the Glasgow '84 Committee donated £167,089 to Macmillan Cancer Support. This was the largest amount raised by any one group in Scotland. The total passed to the charity since 1984 is now £2,521,160.



The annual Art Show/Sale is the biggest of our yearly fundraising events. This year it returns to the splendid galleries at M&Co, Caledonia House, Inchinnan, Renfrewshire thanks to the generosity of Iain McGeoch, M&Co Chairman and his Staff. The gallery is spacious, comfortable, and well lit so browsing can be as leisurely as the public desire. There is extensive parking and good road directions courtesy of the A.A.

Several new artists are joining us this year plus some graduates from the Glasgow School of Art. Most of our loyal favourites are returning. Over 600 pieces of art will be displayed with prices ranging from a few pounds to several thousand pounds.

Pat is of Scottish Polish descent born in Edinburgh and initially studied textiles with Duncan of Jordanstone School of Art. She has won awards from the RSA in London and after a successful career in design and education became a full time artist in 2000. She has exhibited

in many galleries over the years and also has strong connections with St Petersburg where she not only exhibits regularly but judges at their annual schools exhibition.

Macmillan requires 97% funding from voluntary donations and is tackling the problem head on with locally-focussed, innovative services to meet the needs of cancer patients and their families in Glasgow and the surrounding area. The charity provides a range of medical, financial and emotional support to help people living with cancer FROM THE MOMENT THEY ARE DIAGNOSED.

There are now 106 Macmillan Nurses in the west of Scotland. It costs £50,000 to fund ONE Macmillan nurse for ONE year. The Nurse Information Helpline, based in Glasgow, is taking thousands of calls every month from patients, families and carers.
