# **MEMORY & IMAGINATION:**Dutch Italianate and Contemporary Landscapes

Open to public: 23 January to 1 March 2013 Press View: 12 noon, Monday 21 January 2013 Threadneedle Space at Mall Galleries, London SW1

A selection of some of the finest 17<sup>th</sup> century Dutch 'Italianate' landscapes held in any UK public art collection goes on display for six weeks at the Mall Galleries in central London in January 2013. In a fascinating collaboration with Dulwich Picture Gallery, *Memory and Imagination:* Dutch Italianate and Contemporary Landscapes will be the first exhibition in central London for ten years to focus attention on this magical genre of landscape painting.

To highlight the modern legacy of Holland's 'Golden Age', the Mall Galleries, well known for its exhibitions of works by living artists, will hang a smaller number of contemporary landscape works in oil paint, photography and video alongside these paintings, providing an extraordinary sense of continuity and debt by landscape artists of the present to landscape artists of the past.

Many of the Dutch artists in the 17<sup>th</sup> century who journeyed to Italy, the traditional 'home of art', were fascinated and seduced by the magical light and luminous qualities of the Italian countryside. On their return to Holland, their sketchbooks and memory fuelled their artistic imagination, leading to virtuoso landscapes that recall the warm colours, tonal variations and classical features they discovered in the Roman *campagna*. These works were even more highly valued in 17<sup>th</sup> century Holland than the 'domestic' school of Dutch landscape artists so admired by gallery visitors today.

Fifteen of these Dutch 'Italianate' paintings, including major works by Jan Both, Aelbert Cuyp, Adam Pynacker, Nicolaes Berchem and Philps Wouwermans, all executed between 1640 and 1670, will be displayed in the Mall Galleries exhibition. Characterised by a visual richness in observation, as well as by a fine sense of humour, surprise and purity of landscape vision, this genre became highly influential to many artists in the 18th century, before falling out of favour during the 19th century. A major re-evaluation of this genre, reinforced by the amazing quality of 'Italianates' in the Dulwich collection, prompted this opportunity for collaboration between Dulwich Picture Gallery and Mall Galleries. The exhibition organisers aim to introduce many new visitors to the poetic qualities of the Dutch 'Italianates', as well as to their continuing influence on contemporary landscape art.

The selection of contemporary works that will hang alongside the Dutch 'Italianates' includes fascinating works executed in oil paint, video and photography by artists **Emily Allchurch**, **Jeffrey Blondes**, **Martin Greenland**, **Tom Hunter** and **John Stark**.

For over a quarter of a century Dulwich Picture Gallery's award-winning learning and community engagement programmes have reached beyond the Gallery's exhibition programme to bring art to the South London community through outreach initiatives including 'Youth Engagement Programme', 'Good Times: Art for Older People' and 'Prescription for Art'.

The Gallery has been granted £2 million in Catalyst Endowment funding by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) and Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) Catalyst Endowments scheme. This challenges the Gallery to raise an additional £4 million in matching donations by June 2016 in order to secure the grant and establish a £6 million visual arts learning endowment fund.
