Contemporary Art and Historic Garden Combine

A Wiltshire manor garden featuring terraces originally set out in the 17th century is today experiencing a redesign of its topiary enclosures and a deck is being added by the lake. The statues which once featured there and in surrounding areas will shortly be home to a major exhibition of contemporary sculpture. One of the artists whose work will feature in a series of colour themed gardens is Johannes Von Stumm. Johannes was president of the Royal British Society of Sculptors from 2009 – 2012 and is a founding member of Sculpture Network Europe. His work is inspired by opposites, taking concepts such as light and dark, fragility and strength to make sculptures in technically daring combinations of glass, steel and stone. Work by twenty other artists will be displayed throughout the garden.

The exhibition at West Lavington starts on 5 June and is open Thursdays – Sundays until 22 June. Full details are available at www.friendsofthegarden.org.uk
