After a career in the Conservation of Paintings in the museum world (National Gallery Washington, Mauritshuis The Hague, Hamilton Kerr Institute Cambridge, Royal Collection Windsor), Geraldine started painting full time since 2002. Her work ranges from simple line drawings and watercolours to etchings, monoprints and oils, depicting landscapes, places and situations encountered during her travels with a great passion for the Scottish Highlands. She has recently been made 'Artist in Residence' at the Yehudi Menuhin School and is sketching the young musicians towards an exhibition for the centenary appeal in the summer of 2016.
